SHIREHAMPTION AMATEUR RADIO CLUB, Twyford House, Lower High Street, Bristol


Project

This simple CW transmitter will produce about 1 watt output on most hf bands, but the values here are for 7 MHz. I have had great success on this band with power as low as 70 milliwatts.

TRI is the oscillator which produces about 100 milliwatts drive to TR2, the power amplifier. This is keyed by TR3, so that only a few milliamps flow in the key circuit. The layout of the circuit is not at all critical but if a printed circuit is used, a double sided board is recommended with the top, unerched side used as an earth place.

Possible problems may be encountered if using very old, surplus xtals. If the oscillator is a bit sluggish starting, try changing the values of Ci and C2. Also, don't confuse ferrite toroids with dust iron toroids - they are different! (I am sure Colin would assist constructors with any problems. Ed).

TR1 BFY50, BFY51, BFT42, BFT43

TR2 BFY51, 2N3553 (use a heatsink)

TR3 2N6133, BD132 or similar pnp power transistor


T1 5 turns each side of an FT23-61 ferrite toroid

T2 14 turns on T-50-2 dust iron toroid

L1 20 turns on FT-37-61 ferrite toroid

All resistors & watt.

All capacitors polystyrene except O.luF which may be ceramic.
